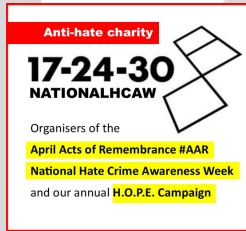


LONDON HATE CRIME AWARENESS CAMPAIGN

We are a registered charity (1184819) which organise the **April Acts of Remembrance** to mark the anniversaries of the London Nail Bomb attacks on Brixton, Brick Lane and Soho, and **National Hate Crime Awareness Week** in October.

We want to encourage the **authorities** (Government, Police and Councils), **key partners** and **communities affected by hate crime** to work together to tackle hate crime.



Definition of Non-Crime Hate Incidents and Hate Crime Offences

"A **non-crime hate incident** is defined as any non-crime incident which is perceived, by the victim or any other person, to be motivated by a hostility or prejudice based upon a personal characteristic - disability, faith, race, transgender identity or sexual orientation."

"A **hate crime offence** is defined as any criminal offence which is perceived, by the victim or any other person, to be motivated by a hostility or prejudice based upon a personal characteristic - disability, faith, race, transgender identity or sexual orientation."

Fundraising

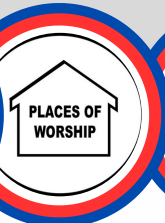
We will organise fundraising events to fund our work.
